

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

JOHN A. (JACK) MASSON
HC 1 BOX 120
Mt. Vernon, OR 97865

confirms the right to use the waters of the JOHN DAY RIVER, a tributary of the COLUMBIA RIVER, for the purpose of IRRIGATION OF 2.0 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for GRANT COUNTY. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is 1871.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-FORTIETH cubic foot per second per acre irrigated from April 1 to September 30; further limited to one acre-foot per acre per calendar month to July 1 and 3/4 acre-foot per acre thereafter; total five acre-feet per acre per season, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 29, T 13 S, R 30 E, W.M.; 80 FEET NORTH AND 1310 FEET WEST FROM THE E 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 29.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4 0.7 ACRE
NW 1/4 NW 1/4 0.5 ACRE
SE 1/4 NW 1/4 0.8 ACRE

SECTION 25
TOWNSHIP 13 SOUTH, RANGE 29 EAST, W.M.

The quantity of water diverted at new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed ONE-FORTIETH cubic foot per second per acre irrigated from April 1 to September 30; further limited to one acre-foot per acre calendar month to July 1 and 3/4 acre-foot per acre thereafter from John Day River.

When in the judgement of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the water user is entitled;


the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

This certificate is issued to confirm an a change in PLACE OF USE AND POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered NOVEMBER 25, 1987, approving Transfer Application 5967, and together with Certificate 57548, supersedes Certificate 47512, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
