CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STATE OF OREGON  
WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

confirms the right to use the waters of DESCHUTES RIVER, a tributary of the COLUMBIA RIVER, for instream use for conservation, maintenance and enhancement of aquatic and fish life, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat and other ecological values.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for DESCHUTES COUNTY. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director, in Volume 12 at Page 282 and Volume 16, at Pages 148 and 396. The date of priority is September 1, 1899. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 4.40 cubic feet per second for the April 1 through October 31 irrigation season:

The description of the stream reach in which flows are to be maintained is as follows:

From the location of the diversion authorized previously under Certificate 74145, located at:

To Lake Billy Chinook (RM 120).

The instream right established by this allocation of conserved water shall replace a portion of instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.341 or 537.346 and shall be in addition to instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.348 or 537.470, unless otherwise specified by a subsequent order establishing a new instream water right.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ALLOCATION OF CONSERVED WATER approved by an order of the Water Resources Director recorded in Special Order Volume 71, Page 202, approving Conserved Water Application CW-41, and together with the remaining right from Conserved Water Application CW-41, to be issued by the Department, supercedes Certificate 74145, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The right is subject to all other terms and conditions of Certificate 74145, and any related decree.
