A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

confirms the right to use the waters of PILCHER CREEK, a tributary of the NORTH POWDER RIVER, for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 38.0 ACRES AND DOMESTIC AND STOCK USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for UNION County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 3, at Page 252. The date of priority is 1885.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed a rate of flow of 1.00 cubic foot per second from March 1st to July 1st and 0.48 cubic foot per second from July 1st to October 1st of each year; the total quantity diverted during each irrigation season not to exceed 95 acre feet.
