A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The flow data and water use report (rate and duty) shall be recorded daily and shall be available to the Watermaster promptly upon request. Monitoring data shall be provided to the Watermaster in a reasonable summary format, approved by the Watermaster. After three irrigation seasons, the Watermaster may modify the need for recording flow data daily to a lesser schedule.

The wells shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation, together with the quantity diverted from the original point of appropriation (HYND WELL #2) shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original point of appropriation.

The water user shall install and maintain an in-line flow meter for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted at all points of appropriation. The type and plans of the measuring devices must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINTS OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered NOVEMBER 27, 2002, approving Transfer Application 8476, and supersedes Certificate 38828, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
