CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

JOHN DILL  
1894 NE MCKAY CREEK RD  
PRINEVILLE OR 97754

confirms the right to use the waters of MCKAY CREEK, a tributary of the CROOKED RIVER, for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 5.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permits E-192 and E-193. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 22, 1913. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.06 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or the equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

13 S	16 E	WM.	33	NE SW	240 FEET NORTH AND 1855 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER OF SW¼ SW¼ OF SECTION 33.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other water right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or the equivalent for each acre irrigated.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate corrects a scrivener's error in Certificate 82260 describing the point of diversion. Certificate 82260 erroneously located the point of appropriation in Township 13 South, Range 14 East, Section 13, NW¼ NW¼, W.M. This certificate supersedes Certificate 82260.

Certificate 82260 described the water rights modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered on July 27, 2006, and recorded in Special Order Volume 69, Page 170, approving a petition by Ochoco Irrigation District under ORS 541.329 for mapping water rights within a district.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
