 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

Vilas D. and Deborah G. Ropp

confirms the right to use the waters of WILLOW CREEK, tributary to the COLUMBIA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 1.0 ACRE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Morrow County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at page 73. The date of priority is 1901.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

1 S	25 E	WM	34	NW NE	80 FEET SOUTH AND 580 FEET EAST FROM THE N1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 34

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 0.015 cubic foot per second, and is limited to the irrigation season MARCH 1 to JULY 1 of each year, measured at the point of diversion from the stream.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install, maintain and operate a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.


When required by the Department, the water user shall install, maintain and operate an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

Prior to October 1, 2008, the water user shall install and maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion. The type and plans of the screen or by-pass device must be approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife prior to beginning of construction, and shall be installed under the supervision of the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

This certificate is issued to confirm an HISTORIC CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered August 17, 2007, approving Transfer Application T-10170, and together with Certificate 83476, supersedes Certificate 167, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
