CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

J.D. LAURANCE

PRAIRIE CITY, OR 97869

Confirms the right to use the waters of REYNOLDS CREEK, tributary to JOHN DAY RIVER for IRRIGATION of 83.0 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Grant County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is 1868.

The amount of water to which such right is entitled, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre irrigated to June 1 and ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre thereafter; further limited to 1.0 acre-foot per calendar month to June 1 and 4.0 acre-feet per acre during the season April 1 to September 30, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 25452, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of orders of the Water Resources Director entered **JAN 18 2008**, approving Transfer Applications 10209 and 10210, and together with Certificates 83478 and 83834 supersedes Certificate 25452.

And said right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree. The right to the use of the water for the purposes aforesaid is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
