CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

C A DUNN
LA GRANDE OR 97850

confirms the right to use the waters of the GRANDE RONDE RIVER, a tributary of the SNAKE RIVER for IRRIGATION of 18.80 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Union County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 8, at Page 1. The date of priority is 1883.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

TwP	Rng	Mer	Sec	Q-Q	Survey Coordinates
2 S	38 E	WM	31	SW SW	400 FEET NORTH AND 200 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER OF SEC 31

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate correctly describes the location of the authorized point of diversion and supercedes Certificate 82334, which replaced a portion of Certificate 6247, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered August 29, 2006, approving Transfer Application 10034.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
