CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

G. W. Smiley

confirms the right to use the waters of Springs in the watershed of Middle Branch of Mud Creek, for STOCK AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 19.8 acres.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for UMATILLA County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director, in Volume 3, at Page 322. The date of priority is 1890.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes and shall not exceed a rate of flow of 0.25 cubic foot per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate is issued to confirm the right modified by provisions of an order recorded at Special Order Volume 74, Page 455, diminishing the right evidenced by Certificate 1751. This certificate, along with Certificate 83897, supersedes Certificate 1751.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
