CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of a WELL in the LITTLE WALLA WALLA RIVER BASIN, for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 9.35 acres and AGRICULTURAL USE (TEMPERATURE CONTROL AND FROST PROTECTION).

This right was perfected under Permit G-13979. The date of priority is MARCH 14, 2000. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed 0.164 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (cfs) or its equivalent in case of rotation.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands is limited to a diversion of one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 4.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the authorized period of use of each year.

The amount of water used for AGRICULTURAL USE is limited to an appropriation of 0.15 cfs per acre.

The authorized period of use for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION and AGRICULTURAL USE (TEMPERATURE CONTROL AND FROST PROTECTION) shall be APRIL 1 through OCTOBER 31.

The point of appropriation is located as follows:

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The water user shall maintain a meter or other suitable measuring device in good working order.

The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under this right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from the well listed on this right, then use of water from the well shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interferences.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate confirms an order of the Water Resources Director entered on March 26, 2008 and recorded in Special Order Volume 74, Page 455 approving a petition by Hudson Bay District Improvement Company under ORS 541.329 for mapping water rights within a district.
