CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

L. AND M. HOPKINS (TRUSTEES)

confirms the right to use the waters of WEST BRANCH MUD CREEK, a tributary of PINE CREEK, for IRRIGATION OF 18.9 acres.

This right was perfected under Permit S-2392. The date of priority is MARCH 25, 1915. This right is limited to an amount beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.24 cubic foot per second or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre (or its equivalent) during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with the prior water rights of others.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

When in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

The diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the water user is entitled;

The type and plan of the measuring device must be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of the Watermaster.


The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old pint of diversion under the subject right and shall not exceed 0.24 cubic foot per second.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.

This certificate confirms an order of the Water Resources Director entered on March 26, 2008 and recorded in Special Order Volume 74, Page 455 approving a petition by Hudson Bay District Improvement Company under ORS 541.329 for mapping water rights within a district. This certificate supersedes water right Certificate 68011.

The issuance of this superseding certificate doe not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.
