CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of TWO UNNAMED RESERVOIRS CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-11188, TRIBUTARIES OF TUALATIN RIVER, AND TUALATIN RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF WILLAMETTE RIVER for NURSERY OPERATIONS on 18.6 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 50805. The date of priority is DECEMBER 20, 1988. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.67 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed and operated to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife specifications.

Water shall not be appropriated from direct flow during the period from July 31 through September 15 of each year.

The amount of water used for NURSERY OPERATIONS is limited to a diversion of 0.15 cubic foot per second per acre. For the irrigation of containerized nursery plants, the amount diverted is limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 5.0 acre feet per acre per year. For the irrigation of in ground nursery plants the amount of water diverted is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre feet per acre per year. The use of water for NURSERY OPERATIONS may be made at anytime of the year that the use is beneficial. For the

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate at any time before it has issued, and after the time has expired for the completion of the appropriation under the permit, or within three months after issuance of the certificate.
