confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL in the Salmon River Basin for QUASI-MUNICIPAL USES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11335. The date of priority is JUNE 3, 1991. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.37 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate at any time before it has issued, and after the time has expired for the completion of the appropriation under the permit, or within three months after issuance of the certificate.

Use of water from the well, as allowed herein, shall be regulated if the well displays:

- (a) An average water level decline of three or more feet per year for five consecutive years; or
- (b) A total water level decline of fifteen or more feet; or
- (c) A hydraulic interference decline of fifteen or more feet in any neighboring well providing water for senior exempt uses or well covered by prior rights.

The water user shall maintain a meter or other measuring device suitable to the Director, and shall keep a complete record of water uses.

The water user shall be responsible for complying with each of the following requirements for measuring water levels in the well.

- (a) A water level measurement shall be made each year at the time of spring high water during the period March 15 through April 15.
- (b) All water level measurements shall be made by a qualified individual. Qualified individuals include certified water rights examiners, licensed water well drillers, registered geologists, registered professional engineers, registered land surveyors, or the water user.
- (c) Any qualified individual measuring a well shall use standard methods shall use methods of procedure and equipment designed for the purpose of well measurement. The equipment shall be well suited to the conditions of construction at the well. A list of standard methods of procedure and suitable equipment shall be available from the Department.
- (d) The water user shall submit a record of the measurement to the Department on a form available from the Department. The record of measurement shall be received not later than 30 days from the date of the measurement.

The Department shall determine when any of the declines cited above are evidenced by the required well measurements.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge to determine the water level elevation in the well at all times.

The Director may require water level or pump tests every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.
