CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

COOS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

confirms the right to use the waters of WINCHESTER CREEK, a tributary of SOUTH SLOUGH, for SUPPLEMENTAL INDUSTRIAL USE.

This right was perfected under Permit 50938. The date of priority is MAY 26, 1987. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 7.0 GALLONS PER MINUTE (GPM), measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

This supplemental source may be used only when the primary source is unavailable either due to lack of water, equipment malfunction that restricts access to the primary source or any problem beyond the control of the County that actually limits full access to the primary source. In the event the County must resort to the supplemental source, such use shall be for no longer than absolutely necessary and shall not exceed the 7.0 GPM limitation of the primary source. In the event both sources are used simultaneously, the total diverted from both sources shall not exceed 7.0 GPM limitation of the primary source.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**


This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate at any time before it has issued, and after the time has expired for the completion of the appropriation under the permit, or within three months after issuance of the certificate.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
