CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

KENNETH E AND KAY B COFFIN
257 SCHOLTZEL ST
LEAVENWORTH WA 98826

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL in the Columbia River Basin for COMMERCIAL USE.

This right was perfected under Permit G-11724. The date of priority is NOVEMBER 8, 1993. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 70.0 GALLONS PER MINUTE, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge to determine the water level elevation in the well at all times.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate at any time before it has issued, and after the time has expired for the completion of the appropriation under the permit, or within three months after issuance of the certificate.

- C. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The water user shall report a March static level in the well to the Groundwater/Hydrology Section of the Water Resources Department by April 15 of each year. The measurement shall be made by a certified water rights examiner, registered professional geologist, certified engineering geologist, or professional engineer.

Use of water from the well(s) shall not be allowed if the well(s) displays an (A) average water level decline of 3 or more feet per year for 5 consecutive years; or (B) a water level decline of 15 or more feet in fewer than 5 consecutive years; or (C) a water level decline of 25 or more feet; or (D) a hydraulic interference decline of 25 or more feet in any neighboring well with senior priority which provides water for an authorized use.

The Water resources Department has determined that the initial water level in the well is 45.15 feet below land surface. That is the level from which the cited declines in (A), (B), and (C) above will be referenced


The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.
