CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

MARK AND JOLLY KRAUTMAN
4194 71ST AVENUE SE
SALEM OREGON 97301

confirms the right to use the waters of DETROIT RESERVOIR, constructed under Permit R-1625, tributary of the NORTH SANTIAM RIVER, for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 25.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 31373. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 23, 1966. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 53.8 ACRE FEET STORED WATER ONLY, if available at the original point of diversion located in LOT 3 (NE¼ NW¼), SECTION 22, T 9 S, R 1 E, WM; 520 FEET SOUTH AND 370 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER, STOUT DLC 49, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and is subject to the terms and conditions of Contract No. 14-06-100-5428, or a satisfactory replacement, between the Bureau of Reclamation and the water user, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department. This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.


When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a head gate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original point of diversion.

This certificate is issued to confirm an ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director, entered December 8, 1997, at Special Order Volume 51, Page 1346, approving Transfer Application 6870; to DIMINISH the character of USE of the water right as approved by an order of the Water Resource Director entered September 5, 2008, at Special Order Volume 75, Page 663-664; and supersedes Certificate 40590, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
