CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

BRIDGE WATER DISTRICT HC 85 BOX 53B MYRTLE POINT OR 97458

confirms the right to use the waters of MIDDLE FORK COQUILLE RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF COQUILLE RIVER for GROUP DOMESTIC USE FOR 43 HOUSEHOLDS.

This right was perfected under Permit 52719. The date of priority is MAY 27, 1994. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.044 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS) FOR GROUP DOMESTIC USE FOR 43 HOUSEHOLDS; FURTHER LIMITED TO NOT MORE THAN 0.005 CFS PER HOUSEHOLD FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION DURING THE PERIOD LISTED BELOW, measured at the point of diversion.

Period of allowed use is December 1 through April 30 for group domestic use; further limited from May 1 through November 30 to human consumption only.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

A. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate at any time before it has issued, and after the time has expired for the completion of the appropriation under the permit, or within three months after issuance of the certificate.

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- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

The water user shall not construct, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage in the channel of the subject stream without providing a fishway to ensure adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The water user is directed to contact the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife before beginning of any in-channel obstruction.

The water user shall maintain a totalizing flow meter as identified in OAR 690-507-645.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
