 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

CADDOCK PROPERTIES
 1717 CHICAGO AVE
 RIVERSIDE CA 92507

confirms the right to use the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM, A TRIBUTARY OF NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, WITH ANY DEFICIENCIES TO BE MADE UP FROM NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF UMPQUA RIVER, AND "THE BENCH" RESERVOIR, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-11917, for IRRIGATION of 16.8 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 52686. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 29, 1989 FOR LIVE FLOW AND 3.0 ACRE-FEET, AND MARCH 8, 1991 FOR 4.8 ACRE-FEET. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.167 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND AND 7.8 ACRE-FEET, measured at the point of diversion.

Period of allowed use is April 1 through June 15 and September 16 through September 30 from live flow; and April 1 through September 30 for stored water.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate at any time before it has issued, and after the time has expired for the completion of the appropriation under the permit, or within three months after issuance of the certificate.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the diversion on the North Umpqua River.


Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
