CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of DRY CREEK, a tributary to PINE CREEK for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 91.4 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-29083. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 21, 1962. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.36 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 44557, State Record of Water Right Certificates, diminished by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUL 07 2009, approving Permit Amendment T-10777. This certificate supercedes Certificate 44557.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to the existing minimum flow policies established by the Water Policy Review board.
