 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

KENO WATER CO.

confirms the right to use the waters of TWO WELLS in the Klamath Basin for DOMESTIC USE FOR 96 LOTS.

This right was perfected under Permit G-5924. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 19, 1973. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.33 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.165 CFS FROM EACH WELL or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the wells.

The wells are located as follows:

The use shall be further limited to appropriation of water only to the extent that it does not impair or substantially interfere with existing surface water rights of others.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The wells shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the wells at all times.


NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate at any time before it has issued, and after the time has expired for the completion of the appropriation under the permit, or within three months after issuance of the certificate.

The water user shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device and keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
