confirms the right to use the waters of FROST GULCH AND CHOKE CHERRY GULCH, tributaries to the WEST FORK ILLINOIS RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 7.8 ACRES AND DOMESTIC.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Josephine County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 13, at Page 70. The date of priority is 1873.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed one cubic foot per second for each 50 acres of land irrigated during the irrigation season from April 1 to November 1 of each year, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:


The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The right shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contain in the decree.
