CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to store the waters of PANTHER CREEK, a tributary of NORTH YAMHILL RIVER, in a PANTHER CREEK RESERVOIR, appropriated under Permit 34661, for MUNICIPAL USE.

The right to store these waters was perfected under Permit R-5527. The date of priority is OCTOBER 22, 1969. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year under this right is not more than 66.0 acre-feet.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The area submerged by this reservoir is as follows:

When inflow into the reservoir exceeds 0.3 cubic foot per second (cfs), the overage shall be released into the stream below. These releases shall be accomplished through the bottom outlet entirely when the overage is in the range of 0 – 0.2 cfs. The overage in excess of 0.2 cfs may be released through the spillway. Water shall be released through an automatically controlled outlet.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate at any time before it has issued, and after the time has expired for the completion of the appropriation under the permit, or within three months after issuance of the certificate.
