CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

STATE OF OREGON  
WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

confirms the right to use the waters of the Deschutes River, tributary to the Columbia River, for instream use for conservation, maintenance and enhancement of aquatic and fish life, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat and other ecological values; pollution abatement; recreation.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County. The decree is of record at Salem in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director, in Volume 12, at Page 282 and in volume 16, at Pages 1 and 390. The date of priority is October 31, 1900.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used, and shall not exceed:

Reach	April 1 through April 30 and October 1 through October 26	May 1 through May 14 and September 15 through September 30	May 15 through September 14
Reach #1	0.164 Cubic Foot per Second (CFS)	0.218 CFS	0.404 CFS
Reach #2	0.103 CFS	0.103 CFS	0.103 CFS

or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion, from April 1 through October 26.

The description of the stream reaches in which flows are to be maintained is as follows:

Reach #1: From the location of Central Oregon Irrigation District (COID) North Canal diversion authorized previously under Certificate 83571, located approximately at:

To the Madras Gage.

Reach #2: From the Madras Gage to the mouth of the Deschutes River (River Mile 0.0).

Within the specified stream reach, the amount of water to which this right is entitled shall not exceed the quantity of water legally available at the original point of diversion.

The instream right established by this transfer shall replace a portion of instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.341 or 537.346 and shall be in addition to instream water rights established pursuant to ORS 537.348 or 537.470, during the period April 1 through October 26, unless otherwise specified by a subsequent order establishing a new instream water right.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in use and place of use approved by an order of the Water Resources Director recorded in Special Order Volume 78, Page 852, approving Transfer T-10712, and supersedes a portion of Certificate 83571, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The right is subject to all other terms and conditions of Certificate 83571, and any related decree.
