CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of the SOUTH FORK JOHN DAY RIVER, a tributary to the JOHN DAY RIVER for MUNICIPAL USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Grant County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is JANUARY 11, 1897.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 4.94 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, if available at the original points of diversion, the Dayville Ditch and Spring near the line between SW¼ SE¼ and SE¼ SE¼, Section 11, T 13 S, R 26 E, WM, provided the total diverted by all rights established by Certificate 25492 shall not exceed 5.0 cfs, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

MUNICIPAL USES
WITHIN THE CITY OF DAYVILLE, OREGON

The quantity of water diverted at the new points of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original points of diversion.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain headgates, in-line flow meters, weirs, or other suitable measuring devices for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The types and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 84235, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered APR 23 2010, approving Transfer Application T-10749.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
