This right was perfected under Permit 7961. The date of priority is MAY 28, 1927. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1.0 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The quantity of water diverted at the new points of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 1.15 cubic foot per second.

When in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices, the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the water user is entitled. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Watermaster before beginning of construction and the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of the Watermaster.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION, approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered NOVEMBER 3, 1983, at Special Order Volume 37, Page 560, approving Transfer Application 5295, as amended by an order of the Water Resources Director entered November 21, 1983, at Special Order Volume 37, Page 690, and supersedes Certificate 10952, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the water user to install a staff gage or other suitable measuring device(s) as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the water user to install a measuring device(s), the water user shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the devices in good working order and shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring devices. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.
- B. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water-use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

WITHDRAWN

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe (with a minimum diameter of 8" for any in-channel reservoir) or the provision of other means determined by the Department capable of evacuating the water when necessary.

The water user shall pass all live flow outside the storage season described above.

The Director may require the user to measure inflow and outflow, above and below the reservoir respectively, to ensure that live flow is not impeded outside the storage season. Measurement devices and their implementation must be acceptable to the Director, and the Director may require that data be recorded on a specified periodic basis and reported to the Department annually of more frequently.

Notwithstanding that Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has made a determination that fish screens and/or by-pass devices are not necessary at this time, the water user may be required in the future to install, maintain, and operate fish screening and/or by-pass devices to prevent fish from entering the diversion, and to provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish.

This right allows an annual appropriation (not to exceed the specified volume). This right does not provide for the appropriation of water for out-of-reservoir uses, the maintenance of the water level or maintaining a suitable freshwater condition. If any water is to be used for out-of-reservoir purposes, a secondary water right is required. If any additional live flow is to be appropriated to maintain either the water level or a suitable freshwater condition, an additional water right is required.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream decreases to the point that it no longer meets state and federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.
