CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of CLEAR CREEK, tributary to COW CREEK for IRRIGATION of 6.95 ACRES and STOCK USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Douglas County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 11, at Page 1. The date of priority is 1888.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

32 S	5 W	WM	11	NE SE	130 FEET SOUTH AND 700 FEET WEST FROM E1/4 CORNER, SECTION 11

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed one cubic foot per second for each 70 acres of land irrigated during the irrigation season.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The water user shall maintain a fish screen at the new point of diversion.


This certificate is issued to confirm changes in POINT OF DIVERSION AND PLACES OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered May 16, 2008, at Special Order Volume 74, Pages 892 through 901, approving Transfer Application T-6682, and together with Certificate 84073, supersedes Certificate 9644, State record of Water Right Certificates.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
