CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

H RICHARD BRYANT 4934 RAY BELL RD NE SAINT PAUL OR 97137

confirms the right to use the waters of UNNAMED STREAM, a tributary of Willamette River, for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 44.4 ACRES and MAINTENANCE of BRYANT WILDLIFE RESERVOIR, constructed under Permit R-11473, for WILDLIFE.

This right was perfected under Permit 51501. The date of priority is MAY 21, 1990. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.66 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), being 0.56 CFS for irrigation and 0.10 CFS for wildlife or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

In the interest of conserving groundwater, this right may be exercised to satisfy the primary right provided that the total quantity of water diverted from all sources does not exceed ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from direct flow and storage. This right is limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate at any time before it has issued, and after the time has expired for the completion of the appropriation under the permit, or within three months after issuance of the certificate.
