 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use the waters of WEST FORK WILLIAMS CREEK, tributary to WILLIAMS CREEK for IRRIGATION of 3.1 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Josephine County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 2, at Page 339. The date of priority is DECEMBER 1908. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.045 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

39 S	5 W	WM	3	SE NW	2100 FEET SOUTH AND 350 FEET WEST FROM THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 3

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer. The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Prior to October 1, 2011, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The water user shall maintain and operate a fish screen or fish by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's operational and maintenance standards.

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

This certificate is issued to confirm an HISTORIC CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered **MAY 12 2010**, approving Transfer Application T- 10916, and supersedes Certificate 45515, State Record of Water Right Certificates.
