CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO:

confirms the right to use the waters of WALLA WALLA RIVER, a tributary of the COLUMBIA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 2.89 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-1300. The date of priority is July 23, 1912. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.037 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 949, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered on May 27, 2010, and recorded in Special Order Volume 80, Page 1154, approving a petition by Walla Walla River Irrigation District under ORS 541.327 for mapping water rights within a district. This certificate supersedes, in part, Certificate 949.
