CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

ELMO ANGELE
LAKEVIEW, OREGON

confirms the right to use the waters of DRAINAGE DITCHES, a tributary to GOOSE LAKE for IRRIGATION of 58.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-24489. The date of priority is MAY 31, 1950. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1.45 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

Twp	Rng	Mer	Sec	Q-Q
39 S	19 E	WM	13	NE SE
39 S	19 E	WM	13	SW SE

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTEITH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 26875, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUN 17 2010, approving Transfer Application T-9986 for a change in place of use, point of appropriation and to correct scrivener's errors.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
