## CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

WELDON WANKIER 67405 HARRINGTON LOOP RD BEND, OR 97701

confirms the right to use the waters of WHYCHUS CREEK, a tributary to the DESCHUTES RIVER for IRRIGATION OF 11.3 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 120. The date of priority is NOVEMBER 1904. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.225 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FIFTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer. The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 81477, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered approving Transfer Application T-10986 and corrects a scrivener's error in the Section referenced in the point of diversion location.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
