 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

GLENN CHOWNING

confirms the right to use the waters of COLUMBIA RIVER, tributary to PACIFIC OCEAN for IRRIGATION of 51.5 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-37293. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 7, 1974. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 1.28 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS), PROVIDED FURTHER THE TOTAL AMOUNT DIVERTED UNDER ALL WATER RIGHTS FOR PERFECTED UNDER PERMIT 37293 DOES NOT EXCEED 99.92 CFS, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

When required by the Department, the water user or improvement district shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable devices for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

When required by the Department, the water user or improvement district shall operate and maintain the headgate and measuring device, as needed. The water user or improvement district shall report total flow figures when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may operate the headgate and monitor accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in place of use approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered August 8, 2005, at Special Order Volume 66, Page 60, approving Transfer Application T-8376, and together with Certificate 81579, supersedes Certificate 80301, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
