 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

MATILDA MCCALLISTER
 PRINEVILLE OR 97754

confirms the right to use the waters of the SQUAW CREEK, a tributary to the DESCHUTES RIVER for the IRRIGATION OF 204.15 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 4.75 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Crook County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 471. The date of priority is 1901.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 4.178 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, BEING 4.083 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND FOR IRRIGATION AND 0.095 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND FOR SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:



The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
