CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to store the waters of LARCH CREEK, tributary to PINE CREEK for STOCK WATER.

This right was perfected under Permit R-1600. The date of priority is AUGUST 24, 1953. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 24.9 ACRE FEET, if available at the authorized point of diversion, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The dam and reservoir location is as follows:

2 S	13 E	WM	16	SW NW

The diversion from Larch Creek is in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 24, T 2 S, R 12 E, W.M.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in CHARACTER OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered October 24, 1994, at Special Order Volume 48, Page 318, approving Transfer Application 7073, and supersedes Certificate 31905, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the store the waters for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
