CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

CITY OF PORTLAND MULTNOMAH COUNTY DRAINAGE DISTRICT 1 1120 SW 5TH AVE, ROOM 842 PORTLAND OR 97204

confirms the right to use the waters of COLUMBIA SLOUGH, BLUE LAKE, AND ALL DRAINAGE WATER AND SPRINGS WITHIN THE DISTRICT, tributaries to the COLUMBIA RIVER for MAINTENANCE OF FOUR WETLAND MITIGATION PONDS.

This right was perfected under Permit 14393. The date of priority is MAY 18, 1939. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.37 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, with a total diversion of 73.90 ACRE-FEET, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

Water may only be diverted during the normal irrigation season, March 1 to October 31 of each year.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original points of diversion. The original points of diversion are numbers 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, and 62 as shown on the final proof survey map for permit 14393.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

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When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

When required by the Department. The water user or drainage district shall operate and maintain the headgate and measuring device, as needed. The water user or drainage district shall report total flow figures when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may operate the headgate and monitor accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in USE, PLACE OF USE, AND POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered at Special Order Volume 47, Page 244, approving Transfer Application 6817, and together with Certificate 68257, supersedes Certificate 48633, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
