 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

PHILIP W AND GIANNINA MURPHY
 HCR 79 BOX 4
 MONUMENT OR 97864

confirms the right to use the waters of COTTONWOOD CREEK, tributary to NORTH FORK JOHN DAY RIVER for IRRIGATION OF 10.9 ACRES AND DOMESTIC USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Grant County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is 1879. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.27 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, if available at the authorized point of diversion, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

9 S	27 E	WM	12	NE NW	250 FEET SOUTH & 115 FEET WEST FROM N1/4 CORNER, SECTION 12

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre irrigated to June 1 and ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre thereafter; further limited to one acre foot for each acre irrigated per calendar month to June 1 and four acre feet per acre during season April 1 to September 30, measured at point of diversion.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion described as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original point of diversion.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered October 2, 1996, at Special Order Volume 50, Page 647, approving Transfer Application 6795, and supersedes Certificate 44067, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
