CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

PERRY KNOTTS  
PILOT ROCK, OREGON

confirms the right to use the waters of CALIFORNIA GULCH, a tributary of the UMATILLA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 12.0 ACRES OF LAND, DOMESTIC and STOCK USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County. The decrees are of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 3, at Page 127. The dates of priority are 1882 for 4.0 acres 1898 for 8.0 acres.

The use is limited to 0.15 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND, subject to the provisions of paragraph 33 of said decree and all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

This certificate is issued to amend and supersede Certificate of Water Right No. 2576 to be consistent with an Order of the Circuit Court for the County of Umatilla dated August 26, 2010. The Order (CV 10-0929) corrected a scrivener's error in the Final Decree in the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights of the Various Claimants to the Waters of the Umatilla River and its Tributaries, a Tributary of the Columbia River, in Umatilla County, Oregon, entered on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of September, 1916.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
