CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

confirms the right to use WASTE WATER from Winn Land in SE ¼ NE ¼ Section 3, Township 5 North, Range 35 East, W.M.; for the purpose of SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 3.4 ACRES. The right was perfected under Permit S-6949. The date of priority is AUGUST 28, 1925.

The use is limited to 0.04 cubic foot per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.


The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described, and the amount of water used under this right, together with the amount obtained from other sources of supply for the same land, shall not exceed ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:
