CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

CITY OF MEDFORD
200 IVY ST, RM 177
MEDFORD OR 97501

confirms the right to use the waters of WILLOW CREEK RESERVOIR, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-1118.

This right was perfected under Permit S-20177. The date of priority is OCTOBER 17, 1949. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 46.5 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND from storage in Willow Creek Reservoir, constructed under Permit R-1118, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion at reservoir, released at reservoir and carried downstream to diversion point of Eagle Point Irrigation District Canal used in compensating for water diverted from Big Butte Springs by City of Medford, under this right and other rights.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

A description of the place of use to which this right is as follows:

MUNICIPAL USE IN THE CITY OF MEDFORD AND ADJACENT TERRITORY

Water may be applied to lands which are not specifically described above, provided the holder of this right complies with ORS 540.510(3).


This certificate is issued for a partial perfection of Permit S-20177 as described in OAR 690-320-0040 and by an order of the Water Resources Director entered April 14, 2011 at Special Order Volume 83, Page 936.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate at any time before it has issued, and after the time has expired for the completion of the appropriation under the permit, or within three months after issuance of the certificate.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
