CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

ALAN L AND ARNOLDA L SILBERNAGEL  
40867 COLE SCHOOL RD  
STAYTON OR 97383

confirms the right to use the waters of DETROIT RESERVOIR, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-1625, a tributary to the NORTH SANTIAM RIVER for IRRIGATION of 8.8 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 28499. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 4, 1963. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 18.9 ACRE FEET, if available at the authorized points of diversion, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year and is subject to the terms of Contract No. 14-06-100-2819, between the Bureau of Reclamation and the District.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered May 20, 1997, at Special Order Volume 51, Page 457, approving Transfer Application 7645, and together with Certificate 74374, supersedes Certificate 44851, State record of Water Right Certificates.


**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
