CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

LARRY W. AND DOROTHEA M. NULL
12022 E MAPLETON ROAD
MAPLETON, OR 97453

confirms the right to use the waters of the SIUSLAW RIVER, a tributary of the PACIFIC OCEAN for DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED FOR TWO HOUSEHOLDS, FURTHER LIMITED TO HUMAN CONSUMPTION ONLY.

This right was perfected under Permit S-52221. The date of priority is NOVEMBER 22, 1993. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.01 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS) – DOMESTIC USE EXPANDED FOR TWO HOUSEHOLDS; FURTHER LIMITED TO 0.005 CFS HUMAN CONSUMPTION ONLY FOR EACH HOUSEHOLD LISTED BELOW, measured at the point of diversion.

Period of allowed use is January 1 through June 15 and September 16 through December 31 for domestic use expanded for two households; further limited to 0.005 CFS June 16 through September 15 for human consumption only per household.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the water user to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the director notifies the water user to install a meter or other measuring device, the water user shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation –period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.
- B. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the period of water use and place and nature of use of water under the right. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The water user shall maintain and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the diversion.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action, including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plans.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 84576, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUN 03 2011, approving Transfer Application T-11205.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
