CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

DEL-VIEW WATER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT 283 OSAGE DR ROSEBURG, OR 97470

confirms the right to use the waters of the NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary to the UMPQUA RIVER for IRRIGATION of 18.4 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-50793. The date of priority is MAY 30, 1989. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.2304 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use to which this right is appurtenant is as follows:

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed and operated to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife specifications.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use, without waste, on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review of the order must be filed within 60 days of the date of service.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

This certificate is issued to correct a scrivener's error in the place of use described on Certificate 77749. This Certificate supersedes Certificate 77749 and describes that portion of the water right Certificate 77020, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of orders of the Water Resources Director entered October 15, 2001, and recorded at Volume 55, Pages 1129-1137, approving Transfer Applications T-7812, T-7813, and T-8243.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described. The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
