CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of SCOGGINS RESERVOIR for WATER QUALITY CONTROL.

This right was perfected under Permit S-35792. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 20, 1963. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 10,600 ACRE-FEET FROM THE RESERVOIR RELEASED AT A RATE OF UP TO 74.0 CFS or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion from the reservoir is located as follows:


The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

WATER QUALITY CONTROL
Within the Tualatin River

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484 and ORS 536.075. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 183.484, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied. In addition, under ORS 537.260 any person with an application, permit or water right certificate subsequent in priority may jointly or severally contest the issuance of the certificate within three months after issuance of the certificate.
