 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

COUNTY OF JOSEPHINE
 GRANTS PASS OR 97526

confirms the right to use the waters of MCMULLEN CREEK, tributary to DEER CREEK for MAINTENANCE OF LAKE SELMAC FOR RECREATION.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Josephine County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 13, at Page 70. The date of priority is AUGUST 22, 1902. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.33 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, during the irrigation season from April 1 to November 1 of each year.

The point of diversion is located as follows:


The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
