CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

NORMA APPLE 47363 SLAUGHTERHOUSE RD HALFWAY OR 97834

confirms the right to use the waters of a PRONG OF EAST BRANCH OF CLEAR CREEK, tributary of Pine Creek, for Tract No. 1 and A PRONG OF CLEAR CREEK, tributary of Pine Creek for Tract No. 2, for IRRIGATION of 22.0 ACRES and DOMESTIC AND STOCK USE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 11, at Page 235. The date of priority is 1882. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed ONE-FORTIETH of once cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion and a total limitation of one acre-foot per acre during July, one acre-foot per acre during August and one-half acre-foot per acre during September of each year.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and shall be subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.

By March 1, 2015, the water user shall install an approved fish screen at the point of diversion. The water user shall provide to OWRD a written statement from Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) that the installed screen meets the state's criteria, or that ODFW has determined a screen is not necessary. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may
