 CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

WALLACE ROMSOS
 1823 BIRCH
 RICHLAND WA 99352

confirms the right to use the waters of SOUTH FORK WALLA WALLA RIVER, tributary to WALLA WALLA RIVER, a tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER for DOMESTIC, LIVESTOCK, AND IRRIGATION OF 0.54 ACRE.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 12, at Page 9. The date of priority is 1891.

The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially and shall not exceed one and one-half miner's inches per acre measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

Water shall be acquired from the same source as the original point of diversion.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original point of diversion described as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may either petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in place of use and point of diversion approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered March 15, 2007, at Special Order Volume 71, Page 343, approving Transfer Application 10219, and together with Certificates confirming Transfer Application 8587 and Transfer Application 10220, supersedes Certificate 81641, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in said decree.
