CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL, tributary to DESCHUTES RIVER BASIN for IRRIGATION of 1.54 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-12549. The date of priority is AUGUST 11, 1993. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.019 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

Twp	Rng	Mer	Sec	Q-Q	Measured Distances
15 S	10 E	WM	18	NW SW	625 FEET SOUTH & 193 FEET EAST FROM W1/4 CORNER, SECTION 18

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. The period of use under this right is limited to March 1 through October 31 of each year.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation, together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original point of appropriation located as follows:

The water user shall maintain an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this right, then use of water from the well shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interferences.

Use of water under authority of this right may be regulated if analysis of data available discloses that the appropriation will measurably reduce the surface water flows necessary to maintain the free-flowing character of a scenic waterway in quantities necessary for recreation, fish and wildlife in effect as of the priority date of the right or as those quantities may be subsequently reduced.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The Department may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use without waste on the lands or place of use described. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.


By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered MARCH 15, 2007, at Special Order Volume 71, Page 330, approving Transfer Application 10101, and together with Certificate 82932, supercedes Certificate 79609, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The use confirmed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
