CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

VARDAN AND MEGAN RIGBY
66741 E BIRCH CREEK ROAD
PILOT ROCK OR 97868

confirms the right to use the waters of A WELL, within the EAST BIRCH CREEK for IRRIGATION of 4.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit G-13998. The date of priority is APRIL 17, 2000. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.037 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

1 S	32 E	WM	21	SW SW	450 FEET NORTH AND 350 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 21

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original point of appropriation described as follows:

Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (Columbia River Basalt) as the original point of appropriation (UMAT 102).

The Director may require the water user to install a totalizing flow meter or other suitable device for measuring at each point of appropriation. If the Director notifies the water user to install totalizing flow meters or other measuring devices, the water user shall install such devices specified by the Director within the period allowed in the notice. NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order and shall all the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices.

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this right, then use of water from the well(s) shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interferences.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge to determine the water level elevation in the well at all times.

The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this right may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the right.

This right is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.


By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered FEBUARY 28, 2011, at Special Order Volume 83, Page 669, approving Transfer Application 11018, and together with Certificate 86858, supercedes Certificate 83663, State record of Water Right Certificates.
