CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

JOSEPH L SONKA  
901 NW CHADWICK LANE  
MYRTLE CREEK OR 97457

confirms the right to use the waters of SOUTH UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of the UMPQUA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 7.2 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-19256. The date of priority is January 30, 1950. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.09 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion.

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:



The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

This certificate describes that portion of the water right confirmed by Certificate 22755, State Record of Water Right Certificates, NOT modified by the provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered November 5, 1998, at Special Order Volume 52, page 960, approving Transfer Application 6058.
