CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

THIS CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO

confirms the right to use the waters of SOUTH FORK JOHN DAY RIVER, tributary to JOHN DAY RIVER for IRRIGATION of 6.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit S-8731. The date of priority is OCTOBER 15, 1928. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 0.08 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, IF AVAILABLE TO THE ORIGINAL POINT OF DIVERSION; NW ¼ NE ¼, SECTION 24, T 13 S, R 26 E, W.M., CUMMINGS DITCH – 1200 FEET SOUTH AND 2650 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER OF SECTION 24, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion.

The points of diversion (POD) are located as follows:

13 S	27 E	WM	18	NE NW	ADDITIONAL POD - 500 FEET SOUTH AND 100 FEET WEST FROM N1/4 CORNER, SECTION 18

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original point of diversion.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's operational and maintenance standards.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in PLACE OF USE AND AN ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered JUNE 29, 2010, at Special Order Volume 81, Page 302, approving Transfer Application 10982, and together with Certificate 86385, supercedes Certificate 52983, State record of Water Right Certificates.
